



Ministry Programs

Students pursuing a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree also develop an emphasis in one of the ministry programs listed in this section. Ministry programs are available either with a BS or BA, except Biblical Research (BA only).

MINISTRY PROGRAM STANDARD REQUIREMENTS

Christian Discipleship (PCM100) and Principles of Evangelism (PCM222) are required in all Central degrees. These courses provide direction in the common goals for all ministry students: personal spiritual growth and the ability to evangelize and disciple others. Other standard requirements for ministry courses are listed below and found in **bold type** within the suggested course of study.

- Service and Leadership Training Courses (11 hours): Serving in Community (SALT-C1), Biblical Leadership (SALT-C2), Leadership Ministries (SALT-C3), Vocational Preparation (SALT-C4), Field Experience (SALT-C5) and Personal Assessment (SALT-C6). These courses expose students to a variety of principles and practical experiences that are preparatory to full-time ministry. Leadership Ministries (SALT-C3) exposes students to service opportunities in their areas of ministry study through interaction with practitioners, knowledge of pioneers in the field, awareness of personal gifts, and planning their course of study.
- Program Ministry Courses (18 hours): Six courses detailed in the specific program pages. These required courses start with a “Foundations” course (usually taken during the second semester of the second year) and specific ministry courses in theory, methods, administration, and leadership.
- Designated General Studies Courses (9 hours): Three courses that are relevant to the field of study count towards the general studies requirements, but are considered part of the program requirements. Students who change ministry programs are required to take the appropriate general studies course for their new program, even if they had already completed an equivalent general studies course in their original program.

Both the Leadership Ministries and the proper Program Foundations course must be passed in order to continue pursuing a ministry program. Students who do not pass those courses may be redirected into the Associate of Biblical Studies, Bachelor of Religious Studies, or Bachelor of Science in Christian Ministries.

Career Opportunities

The program is designed to qualify graduates for further theological studies at seminary. Students who graduate with a Biblical research degree may serve in preaching and teaching roles in a local church. They can pursue Bible translation options in missions, based on the extensive Biblical language requirements. Careers in writing and editing theological writing are also possible.

Program Goals

The Biblical Research program can be developed only within the Bachelor of Arts degree. In addition to the BA degree goals (page 46), students in the Biblical Research program will be able to do the following:

1. Translate selections of the Bible from the original languages into English using the basic rules of grammar and syntax.
2. Generate an exegetical paper using the original Biblical languages, Bible study tools, scholarly research, sound principles of interpretation, and collaboration.
3. Apply language and research skills to lessons and sermons.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Students who graduate with a Christian Counseling degree are qualified to do personal religious counseling as part of their own ministries. Graduates are sometimes employed to do spiritual counseling within a church. They also serve in a leadership capacity through the small groups ministry of a church. They can be employed as a camp counselor or in certain social work positions. A graduate is well qualified to pursue a master's degree in counseling, which is required to be eligible for state licensure. A master's degree and a license are required to work as a counselor in many contexts.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The Christian Counseling program can be developed either within the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree. In addition to those degree goals, students in the Christian Counseling program will be able to do the following:

1. Demonstrate competence in counseling skills
2. Evaluate major counseling theories and techniques against a Biblical worldview
3. Integrate Biblical truths into counseling contexts
4. Meet entrance requirements to graduate programs that advance the student toward licensure as a professional counselor.

Career Opportunities

Students who graduate with a Christian Education degree are trained for ministry in a local church in areas such as director of children's ministry, adult education, discipleship, small groups, involvement, and Christian education. Many Christian schools also accept a Christian education degree as qualification for teaching at the preschool and elementary level. Students may also pursue a graduate degree in education leading to initial teaching certification from different universities.

Program Goals

The Christian Education program can be developed either within the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree. In addition to those degree goals, students in the Christian Education program will be able to do the following:

1. Prepare age-appropriate Bible lessons that communicate and apply Biblical truth to the needs of students.
2. Identify the characteristics, needs, and developmental tasks across the human lifespan.
3. Evaluate products and resources that seek to assist the educational ministry of the church.

Some serve in small churches where they are “general practitioners” in multiple areas of ministry. Campus ministry opportunities are also available for those who have tailored their studies appropriately. Graduates may also pursue advanced degrees for specialized training in ministry areas.

Career Opportunities

Graduates from the Cross-Cultural Ministry program often serve as direct support missionaries in a foreign field. They may work as support staff with mission organizations. Some move to foreign countries and volunteer for a church while working in secular employment. Graduates can also work with local churches to send more workers for the harvest. Some have chosen to pursue advanced degrees for additional training in Bible translation and missional studies.

Program Goals

The Cross-Cultural Ministry program can be developed either within the Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree. In addition to those degree goals, students in Cross-Cultural Ministry will be able to do the following:

1. Articulate missiological principles and strategies that influence the development of cross-cultural ministries.
2. Equip a church to be actively involved in supporting missions.
3. Develop a ministry strategy that will prepare the student to enter a chosen mission field.

After graduation, students may pursue advanced degrees from a seminary to develop specialized leadership skills.

1. Be conversant with the nature, function, and responsibilities of the pastoral ministry with emphasis on preaching, Biblical leadership, and congregational development.

FIELD EDUCATION

Central's field education program provides the opportunity to serve in a located ministry under the supervision of an experienced leader. Each student seeking a Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts degree is required to complete this program. It is not required for an Associate Degree, Bachelor of Religious Studies degree, or certificate. The field education requirement is normally completed before or during the student's fourth year. Field education consists of work done at a remote field and must be completed prior to graduation.

Field education is fulfilled by completing the following two components:

SALT-C4: VOCATIONAL PREPARATION (1 HOUR)

Students must complete SALT-C4 (previously SALT301) before participating in a Field Experience. This course enables the student to receive the information necessary to prepare for, to find, and to participate in a field experience. Students will not receive credit for any field experience occurring prior to successful completion of SALT301 or SALT-C4. Transfer students must attend Central at least one semester before enrolling in SALT-C4.

SALT-C5: FIELD EXPERIENCE (6 HOURS)

Students are required to serve a minimum of 300 hours and 10 weeks in their Field Experience. The hours may be spread over a summer (30 hours per week for 10 weeks), a semester (20 hours per week for 15 weeks), or a school year (10 hours per week for 30 weeks). With approval of the Field Education Director, the student's advisor, and the Vice President of Academics, this requirement may be met by independent study, additional coursework in the ministry emphasis, or qualified, significant personal ministry experience.

In order to earn credit, the student must comply with the standards and procedures presented in the SALT-C4 class. Students are responsible for living expenses associated with the time they spend completing their Field Experience. If taken during a semester, students may maintain full-time enrollment status through independent studies, distance education, or community college courses to transfer back to Central. Credit for Field Experience is given the semester during or after it is finished.
