## **Central Christian College of the Bible**

### **Moberly, MO**

#### **Diversity**

The most recent student diversity amounts were reported in Spring 2012, with 55.1% male and 44.9% female of full-time students. Ethnic groups were self-reported as 89.3% White, 3.9% Black, 2.0% Asian, 1.6% Hispanic, 1.6% Native Indian/Alaskan, & 1.6% Unknown or Other. PELL Grants were received by 68.6% of students.

#### **Retention**

The most recent retention rates calculated from IPEDS show a FT retention rate of 75% for first-time freshmen entering in the Fall of 2010. In comparison, Missouri college report a 67% retention rate. Other Bible colleges in the Midwest report a retention of 66% of full-time students.

#### **Completion**

Based upon the experience of the Freshman classes from 2002-2005 here at Central Christian College of the Bible, the following completion rate has been determined. Using a completion standard involving a time frame of 150 percent of published time (e.g., a 4-year program taking no more than six years), Central has reported to the National Center for Education Statistics a completion rate of 42%.

As a point of comparison, statewide only slightly over 52% of Missouri college students graduate within a six-year period (figures from 2005 cohort data gleaned from IPEDS). Other Bible colleges in the Midwest report a cohort completion rate of 43% within a six-year period.

Some students who attend CCCB and other Bible colleges come with the intention of transferring after one or two years. They come to be grounded in their Christian faith and to benefit from the Christian atmosphere on campus. In one sense they have “completed” their purpose in attending Bible college en route to a more long-range program completion elsewhere.

#### **Placement**

As for placement information, Bachelor’s degree recipients in the classes of 2008-2010 indicated the following plans following graduation:

- 31% Pursue a further degree outside of Central (seminary, university, nursing)
- 29% Enter or remain in paid ministry positions (youth, education, preaching)
- 19% Plan to enter the mission field after raising financial support
- 13% Work and serve as a volunteer / other
- 8% Serve alongside of a spouse in a volunteer capacity
